Software for solving everything.

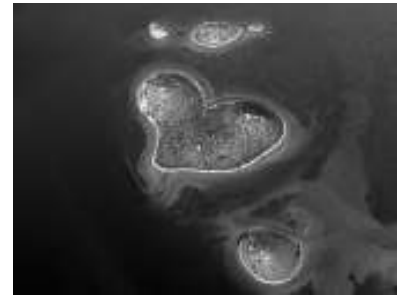
Do you like haiku poetry and why?
